Independent schools have diverse religious or philosophical affiliations. They represent a range of approaches to teaching and learning.



Independent schools are generally not-for-profit institutions founded by groups in the community. All Independent schools are registered with the relevant state or territory education authorities.

Independent schools are primarily accountable to their parent and school communities.

About 10 per cent of Independent schools in NSW operate within approved system authorities. These include the Anglican, Seventh Day Adventist or Lutheran Systems.

STUDENT ENROLMENTS

The rate of enrolment of the Independent school sector has been increasing. In 2023, enrolments in NSW Independent schools grew by 3.6 per cent, outpacing overall student population growth of 0.6 per cent.

Families and other private sources provide most of the recurrent income for Independent schools.

This reduces the amount governments need to spend to educate NSW students by \$2.6 billion a year.

GOVERNMENT FUNDING OF NSW INDEPENDENT SCHOOLS

Government funding for schools is provided by the Australian Government and state and territory governments. The Australian Government is the main government funding source for non-government schools, providing 76 per cent of total government recurrent funding while the NSW Government provides 24 per cent. State and territory governments are the main funding source for government schools. The proportions of private/government funding vary greatly from school to school.

FUNDING MODEL

The current funding model for schools, the Schooling Resource Standard (SRS), comprises base funding plus loadings to address educational disadvantage. Governments reduce the base funding paid to Independent schools according to the school community's estimated capacity to contribute (CTC) to the costs of education, assessed on parental income tax data. This methodology is known as the Direct Measure of Income (DMI). Schools with a higher CTC score receive less per capita base funding.

The majority of NSW Independent school funding (recurrent and capital) comes from private sources.

Parents and communities contributed \$3.6 billion (recurrent and capital) to NSW Independent schools.





MAIN SOURCES OF CAPITAL INCOME

On average, parents and communities provide 92 per cent of capital funding for NSW Independent schools. The amount of capital funding in NSW Independent schools from private sources in 2022 was \$472 million.

Most capital funding is sourced through borrowing, fund raising, levies on parents or school reserves. 4%

AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT CAPITAL GRANTS PROGRAM FOR NSW

In 2022 the Australian Government provided \$22.9 million in capital grants to NSW Independent schools. In 2023 it is estimated that new capital grants for the NSW Independent sector will total approximately \$26.7 million.

In the Independent sector Australian Government capital grants are distributed on a needs basis through Block Grant Authorities, with priority given to disadvantaged school communities with the least capacity to raise funds.

In 2022 the NSW Government provided \$18.6 million in capital grants to NSW Independent schools.

SCHOOL TEACHERS

Independent schools employ more than 19.6 per cent of all teachers in Australian schools. NSW Independent schools employ more than 22 per cent of all teachers in NSW schools.
